The Gem Faire was also held at the fairgrounds this past weekend. Our club had its usual table staffed with members representing all that our organization has to offer. We were steadily busy the whole three days answering questions about field trips, classes, rock identification, meetings and general membership criteria, with many applications given out. One of our members, Rod, brought his field microscope to share an unusual finding of his. Rod has been collecting runoff from his gutters.
